Annual Workshop guest announcement

We are excited to have **Michael Holter** as our workshop/annual meeting artist this **October 16-18 and 19, 2024.** Check out his website <u>www.michaelholter.com</u> to find out more about his background,

exhibitions and awards and view his paintings. He is an amazingly accomplished artist and holds Signature membership in AWS and NWS, to name a few. Michael is most recently written about in the Winter 2024, Watercolor Artist Magazine where he expressed his thoughts on portraiture. He is well known for both his portrait work and landscape. In October he will be teaching us his landscape techniques. He paints very expressively and uses a lot of color. He makes his classes both fun and informative. He begins wet and loose flicking and spattering to keep the intensity of color and to utilize the spontaneous nature of watercolor. He ties that together in an impressionistic approach where he likes to see something representational develop but lets it be looser.




One of his favorite quotes is from Scott Adams, *"Creativity is allowing yourself to make mistakes and art is knowing which ones to keep."*

Michael says, "My work is impressionistic. I like to represent people or places and allow the painting to evolve from the structure of what is recognizable. The challenge is to balance the care needed to make the representation interesting... and perhaps believable, with the freedom, looseness and painterly quality that makes painting so unique and expressive."







Annual meeting review: Ken Call

Attendees of our 2023 workshop led by acclaimed artist Ken Call are still buzzing with excitement after what they describe as an extraordinary learning experience. I am sure you have read the newsletters and have seen all of the awards he has won. Ken had a display of articles in artist's magazines as well as books from some of the many competitions he has won. He is in the current Watercolor Artist magazine article Best of 2023.

At the annual meeting he told us about his inspirations for various pieces of his art and showed us the way his style has changed over the years - however, I want to tell you a little bit about him as a teacher. Some

of the people taking a workshop were comfortable painting figures and took this workshop to further their art from this master. Many of the rest of us were somewhat fearful of what we consider the hardest of all things to paint. . . people! No matter what level each of us entered the workshop, everyone was able to move their art to the next level...and further their knowledge...not only of the figure, but how to be a better painter overall. Whether it involved techniques, strategies or ways of thinking of things, we were able to take what we learned and apply to present and future work.



Ken's demonstrations were great and he was so helpful going around the room seeing to each artist's needs, always available to help and teach us what we needed at that time. I was again reminded of how valuable in-person workshops are, not only for the increased knowledge but also for the camaraderie.

Despite the inevitable fatigue that follows intense artistic endeavors, attendees departed the workshop with a renewed sense of enthusiasm and fulfillment. They expressed gratitude to Ken Call for generously sharing his wisdom, expertise, and passion for art, leaving an indelible mark on all those fortunate enough to participate. ~ Jean Matuszkewski

My life has been enriched by these decisions.


Featured Artist, Jeri Meday continued

JERI: Right now, I'm Recording Secretary, Chair of the Signature Jury, and head up committee work refining our infant Mentor Program, which has been long suggested by retired President, Board and Signature Member Martha Deming.

CNYWS: Tell us more about this new Mentor Program Jeri.

JERI: Since the late 1990's I've been a Board member, Exhibition Chair, and Chair of many of our exhibits and shows. As Chair of the Signature Jury, I see disappointed members. I can empathize with them because I didn't become Signature on my first try either. CNYWS is adding a new Mentor Program, to help make it understandable, that when one does not immediately achieve Signature Status it doesn't mean you're not considered a bad painter, it just means your work didn't meet the published criteria for Signature status in CNYWS. It's CNYWS's goal that once members engage in the program it will propel artists in the right direction towards achieving CNYWS Signature Status.



CNYWS: Have you looked to others for mentorship as your artwork grew and how do you believe you personally grew as an artist doing so?


JERI: Being a teacher, I knew working with someone helps accelerate learning. I love learning and school, and I was fortunate to work briefly with the late Susan Spencer where I became proficient with washes. Judy Hand, another mentor, introduced me to elements of composition and design. I worked with her at her East Syracuse night classes. I also worked with Linda Abbey, she took me under her wing and allowed me to paint with her. I also volunteered with her elementary art classes in inner city Syracuse where we formed a wonderful friendship. Later, I worked with Barbara Kellogg at Cazenovia College and met lots of friendly and helpful people in a Cazenovia watercolor group.

I met Ralph Murray at an Everson demo and spent a summer painting hops barns in the Cherry Valley (by the way, I really was just learning to apply the paint, he was very kind and invited me to his Kirkwood classes. During this time Linda encouraged me to work at Springmaid in North Carolina. Once I saw the beautiful art work and variety of instructors, I was hooked, I'm an art class junkie. I'm thankful for the guiding hands.


